The School Advisory Council worked collaboratively with staff at the school to determine gaps/needs. They brainstormed ways to support the school while keeping student achievement at the forefront of the decision-making process.

The SAC once again responded to our need for additional Chromebooks to add to our inventory at the school. One gap that still exists at FBJH is that students do not have access to Chromebooks in a 1:1 ratio. This is increasingly important given the move towards a cell phone policy that is now in place. Teachers need the ability to have students access technology, without having to rely on students accessing their own phones.
